The eighth section of the Constitution is that which is enabling to Congress. It begins, The Congress shall have power - then follow the various powers without the repetition of the word Congress, except in the seventeenth clause, and in it only for the sake of sense. Such a repetition would have been as unnecessary as to prefix the enacting clause to each section of a Legislative act. The ninth section is disabling throughout. In its first sentence the branch of Government disabled is Congress, by name, and the word Congress occurs but once afterward, in the concluding paragraph of that section. As the eighth section is enabling, while the ninth is in restraint of the powers of Congress, so the tenth section expressly restrains the powers of the States. The word Congress is not in the Habeas Corpus restriction, and certainly it was easy to put it there,...
