




At Freedom's Limit: Islam and the Postcolonial Predicament

This Islam begins to disclose its shape in 1988 around the Rushdie Affair, the collapse of the Berlin wall in 1989 and the first Gulf War of 1991. It is consolidated in the period following September 11, 2001. This "Islam" is a name, a discursive site, a flexible and simultaneously constrained signifier, indeed a geopolitical agon, in and around which some of the most pressing aporias of modernity, enlightenment, liberalism and Reformation are worked out. In the formation that has clustered at this site there are for Islam many metonyms: the veiled or "pious" Muslim woman, the militant, the minority Muslim injured by Western free speech. Each of these figures functions as a cipher enabling repeated encounters with the question "how do we free ourselves from freedom?" Again and again freedom is imagined as western, modern, imperial, a dark imposition of enlightenment. The pious and injured Muslim who desires his and her own enslavement is imagined as freedom's other. At Freedom's Limit shows how this Islam draws upon a colonial history of...
