

After engaging for a time in educational work, he took up the practice of law. Later he was appointed Superintendent of Banking Department for the State of New York, United States bank examiner for New York, and later Comptroller of the Currency. In 1892, Mr. Hepburn was made president of the Third National Bank of New York, and thereafter vice-president of the National City Bank and president of the Chase National Bank of New York. He is director of a number of prominent financial, industrial and commercial organizations, and trustee of Middlebury College and Rockefeller Foundation, member of New York Chamber of Commerce and of various scientific and literary societies.
