

Thanks to its thoroughness, rhetorical skill, and literary power, it has become one of the most widely known of Burke s writings and a classic text in political theory. In the twentieth century, it greatly influenced conservative and classical liberal intellectuals, who recast Burke s Whiggish arguments as a critique of communist and revolutionary-socialist programmes.
