

A motion to reconsider another question may be made and entered in the record, but no further action can be taken thereon when a motion to adjourn is before the house. The motion to adjourn is not debatable, and cannot be amended, laid on the table, committed, postponed, reconsidered, or made ADJOURN, QUORUM. 59 in a committee of the whole. If the motion to adjourn is defeated, there must be some intervening business done before the Chair will receive another motion...
