Instead of that protection, the magistrates themselves had ordered the apostles to be scourged and then imprisoned without a proper hearing. This was a serious crime, severely punished under Roman law. The magistrates might lose their position and be sent to Rome in chains for trial, unless they could justify or satisfactorily explain their unlawful order. Paul knew this, and so insisted upon a proper apology and an honorable discharge by the magistrates in person. This would cause others...
