Following the terrorist attack of 11 September 2001, the Army devoted much of its resources and energy to homeland security operations, toppling the Taliban in Afghanistan, and counterterrorism operations elsewhere in the world. During the latter half of the year, the Army began preparing for a possible invasion of Iraq to overthrow the regime of Saddam Hussein. Outside of war and preparation for war, the Army continued to invest considerable work in transforming itself into a service better suited for the conditions of a post-Cold War world. Along with changes to the operational forces, the Army undertook several major reorganizations of its institutional elements, most notably in Headquarters, Department of the Army (HQDA), and in its logistical systems. Continuing disagreement between the service's senior leaders and Secretary of Defense Donald H. Rumsfeld over the proper course of transforming the Army led to the cancellation of the Crusader self-propelled howitzer in FY 2002.
